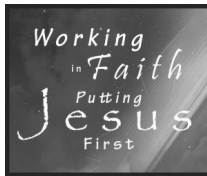

Finally, as part of Sunday morning's Celebration Worship, our guest preacher will be Rev. Dr. James Alexander Forbes, Jr., The Harry Emerson Fosdick Distinguished Professor at Union Theological Seminary.

Also woven into the flow of the weekend are a wide assortment of practical and stimulating workshops, a conferring session to handle the business of the Conference, time to peruse exhibit tables, pool and recreation time, opportunities to be together!

The first Sunday is Communion Sunday, and just as Christ shares bread with us from his table, Glenside UCC shares bread with our hungry neighbors. That says a lot about how this congregation understands its faith.

The members of this church love to be personally involved in mission. Every month a group goes to Old First UCC to help prepare breakfast or distribute clothing. Our youth have been involved with Appalachia Service Project for 14 years. An annual Latin American dinner raises money to help internally displaced refugees in Colombia. This year we plan to start a free community meal.
