The Transformation of Grace-Trinity UCC and its Community!



The journey began in February 1996, when Rev. Dr. Chandra Soans and his wife Betsy, along with Rev. Dr. Russell Mittman, then Conference Minister, PSEC, and Rev. Marty Bupp, then Associate Conference Minister, chose the former Frankford Congregational Church, Philadelphia, to start a new church for

the immigrant and surrounding community. Taking over a dilapidated building in a neighborhood familiar with drug dealers and gun violence was no bed of roses. But, Grace-Trinity believed that 'God calls the faithful out of their comfort zones in order to transform the world around them and to make a difference by shining a light in the darkness'.

Rev Soans and 11 members took the first step of faith on the 1st Sunday of July 1996 and have witnessed God's grace and power in the growth of Grace-Trinity and in creative service to the community. Over 20 years, the church has grown from 11 members to what it is today. A dynamic Sunday School and youth, men's and women's fellowship, cell groups in different locations, and regular fasting and prayer have strengthened our spiritual foundation.

Grace has also testified to God's faithfulness by transforming the community around. The Church has established four Pre-school centers in and around Grace-Trinity. Quality education is received by over 500 needy children and families. Seeds of the gospel reach these homes through Vacation Bible School, Bibles given during graduations, Bible classes, a community Christmas program and Thanksgiving dinner for the needy in the community. In 2006 the church began a housing counseling program to help lower income, first time home buyers, to purchase homes.


Many families have been blessed by the efforts of God's people at Grace-Trinity. Grace-Trinity has become an "Agent of Transformation" in the Philadelphia Area.
