As Christians, we can set an example for our society by having sacred and honest conversations about race. The PSEC Justice & Witness Mission Team is hosting four opportunities to engage in safe, meaningful, substantive, and bold conversations on race, using the UCC curriculum *White Privilege: Let's Talk*. Rev. John Dorhauer, UCC general minister and president, writes: "This curriculum, written by five gifted authors with decades of experience teaching about race and privilege, is presented to enable such dialogue to take place at every level of the Church."
