

NEW ACM-CD POSITION CONFIRMED **WELCOME REV. CEAN JAMES**

At a Conference Special Meeting on Saturday January 21, 2017, PSEC delegates confirmed the selection of the Reverend Cean James to the position of Associate Conference Minister for Congregational Development (ACM-CD). The vote was 186 to 1. Reverend James will begin his Conference ministry on Wednesday February 1, 2017.



Congregational development is not new to our conference. Indeed that work began when Jesus instructed HIS disciples to GO and MAKE disciples (Matthew 28). The information that Cean will share fills books and websites and is the topic of endless conferences, retreats and workshops. What is unique about Cean is his contagious enthusiasm, hard won church growth lessons, and knowledge of our particular way of church life.
