The original building was shared by Reformed, Lutheran and Mennonite congregations. The current stone structure was constructed in 1892 by the reformed (Now UCC) congregation. We also have a parsonage on-site was built in 1910. The current layout of the church includes a social hall and educational wing. But as we know the church is more than just the building.

Heidelberg’s many committees continue to bring God’s light to the congregation and the community. From our Board of Christian Education, providing vacation Bible school, and Sunday school, (to children and adults alike), to our Fellowship committee hosting Bunco or a chili cookoff, to our Evangelism committee, who plan our joint worship services with neighboring churches, to our Spiritual Arts, who express their love of the Lord through music at all of our services.
