## Wonderful Happenings at Love in Action United Church of Christ



On January 22nd, 2017, the congregation known as the United Church of Christ in Warminster finally found their new home at 350 S. York Rd. in Hatboro, PA after searching for more than a year and a half. The multi-use building will serve as a place for worship, education, social services, partnerships, and community.

Shortly thereafter, at a congregational meeting, the community voted to change the name of the congregation to Love In Action United Church of Christ, an Opening and Affirming Congregation.
