## 2017 Spring Meeting Recap

During the weekend of June 9—11, 251 lay and clergy members of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference came together for the 2017 Spring Meeting.

Those gathered had the opportunity to be refreshed, challenged, taught, inspired, connect with friends, enjoy workshops, attend worship and at the same time complete the business of our Conference.

Friday held a day long workshop with Rev. Molly Baskette, author of *"Real Good Church"*. Friday evening opened with Anniversary Church and Anniversary Pastor celebrations followed by our opening worship with Rev. Traci Blackmon, Active Executive Minister for Justice and Witness Ministries at the UCC national office, who shared a very powerful message.

Saturday during the business meeting, the delegates voted in favor of the revised Constitution and By-laws (currently on the [psec.org](http://psec.org) website) and after discussion in small break-out groups, overwhelming voted to approve opening discussions with the Penn Northeast Conference on a possible merger. A team of lay and clergy leaders will be selected to be a part of this discussion group.
