

Confession (based on Acts 9)

L: Just as Jesus called Saul, He also calls each one of us - and all of our churches. P: Sometimes we hear God's call, but we refuse to listen. Sometimes we say no.

Holy Communion

Invitation to the Table including Luke 24:28-32 (CEB)
At this table we meet the Risen Christ. Somehow in the midst of a community gathered in his name, in the signs of bread and cup, in retelling a sacred story.

gathered in his name, in the signs of bread and cup, in retelling a sacred story, Jesus comes alive in our midst. Long ago on Easter day, Jesus was recognized only when He broke the bread with his friends, an event we hear in Luke 24:28-32:

When they came to Emmaus, [Jesus] acted as if He was going on ahead. But they urged Him, saying, "Stay with us. It's nearly evening, and the day is almost over." So, He went in to stay with them. After He took His seat at the table with them, He took the bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Their eyes were opened, and they recognized Him, but He disappeared from their sight. They said to each other, "Weren't our hearts on fire when He spoke to us along the road, and when He explained the scriptures for us?"

In the breaking of our bread, the sharing of our cup, in our gathering together, Christ is with us and all are invited to share at His table.

Communion Prayer (responsively)

God be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to God.

Let us give thanks to God Most High.

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Holy God, we praise You and thank You that You have always been with us. From the beginning You have been our God and formed us to be Your people. While You made us in Your image and gave us Your breath of life, we turned from You. Through prophets and leaders, in word and wonders You called us back to You.

When Your repeated attempts to heal the relationship between us, You became one of us. Taking the name Jesus of Nazareth, you lived as we do. You experienced the full depths of humanity: our hungers and desires; our failures and fears; our joys and laughter; our pain and fragility. By Your willingness, immortal God, to embrace of the chaos of being human and follow where it would lead, You reconciled us. Your path to the cross forced the worst of humanity to meet the best of divinity, and creation was forever changed. Through Your Spirit, You continue to meet us with Your goodness, O God. You bring us into community that shapes and changes us. You rework our lives with Your creative power. Your courage is with us always.

All glory and honor, blessing and power, is Yours, Almighty God, as we praise You with the words You gave us:

Bless all we offer here, and by your power, transform it. May this bread and cup be for us a sharing in Your life, Your resurrection as a foretaste of the glory that awaits us. By sharing in this meal, transform us in witnesses of Your hope and grace. We pray this in Your name. Amen.
