The Current Situation with Ordained Pastoral Leaders

- Not enough pastors for our churches.
- "Over the last 36 years (1985 to 2021), Ordained Ministers only had a numerical net decrease of 474 (4.7%). However, the number of employed Ordained Ministers decreased by over one third (-40.3%), while Retired Ministers and Pastor Emeriti saw an increase of 88.1% over this same 36-year period."*
- Roughly, anywhere between 500-1000 clergy have an active profile circulating across 36 Conferences.
- Currently around 165 clergy profiles are being circulated in PSEC—but that doesn't mean they have indicated interest in serving here.
- Smaller churches with less financial resources still needing pastors and the retirees and mid-careers will likely not "save" us again.
- Truth is, there has always been a crisis with the clergy.*

The Past Is Present: Going Back to the Beginning

- In 18th and 19th centuries, most Protestant churches were served by pastors who served multiple congregations, often with only monthly and sometimes even quarterly visits by an ordained minister.
- As they do now, laypersons provided much of what we consider the work of the Pastor a ministry of presence, support, and even accountability for each other.
- Perhaps God is "right-siding" the church, and empowering the laity as they remember that pastors come and go, but the members remain.
- The Church is returning to the past, with laypersons people taking on a greater role in the church and that is <u>not</u> bad news.

The Four Parts of Biblical Worship

- "They committed themselves to the teaching of the apostles, the life together, the common meal, and the prayers." Acts 2:42
 - o Gathering "life together"
 - Preaching "teachings"
 - o Holy Communion "the common meal"
 - o Prayer

Let's Talk Serving Communion Without A Pastor Being Present

- In our German and larger UCC tradition, clergy are authorized to officiate at two sacraments:
 - o Holy Communion
 - o Baptism
- Lay Persons may distribute the communion elements that have been previously consecrated by an ordained minister.

Laypersons can craft good worship services and preach the Good News – and will need to do so more in the future.

- Training does matter but a heart for God's people, humility, and thoughtfulness matter even more.
- The truth is that it is already happening and we hope to support you as you meet the needs of your congregation.

Crafting And/Or Delivering A Sermon

- Focus on one Scriptural text
- Question: in light of this Scripture, how then shall we live?
- No need to address every verse in the Scripture text
- Context is important but don't get too lost in it
- Telling a story use an illustration, but make sure to connect it to text
- Give credit to the storyteller
- Pay attention to your current moment
- Conclude the sermon with a point

Tips for Delivery A Sermon

- Practice, practice, practice
- Underline key words or sentences to help you emphasize something and keep track of where you are
- Make eye contact as much as you can
- Speak clearly but warmly
- Be yourself
- Don't let the manuscript itself distract the congregation
- Make it always about God and how to live in light of God's presence

Summary

- The Future is Shared
 - Sharing Pastors but also sharing the work of the pastor
 - o The church will always be here, but it will be more lay-led
 - Stepping into the pulpit is part of that trend
 - o God is speaking in the pulpit through the laity
