Father's Day began at the YMCA in Spokane, Washington, on June 19, 1910. Sonora Smart Dodd's father, a Civil War veteran who raised six children by himself, inspired her determination to create a day to honor dads. After hearing a sermon about Mother's Day, Sonora told her pastor that fathers should have a similar holiday honoring them. And here we are. Father's Day.

I have often found myself navigating the complex paths of parenthood with a blend of trepidation and wonder. It has been for me a journey filled with moments of exquisite joy and profound challenge in a crucible of love. As with all days like this one, it is not without it's shadow side. Some of us have lived with the pain of absent fathers and others with pain inflicted by present fathers.

Fatherhood is an act of devotion - a commitment to nurturing and guiding the next generation with wisdom, compassion, and grace. It is a path of deep significance, where the echoes of our influence reverberate far beyond the boundaries of time and space. While my father and grandfather have long since departed this life, their lessons, for good or ill, still shape the person I am becoming.

We pause this day to honor the fathers in our lives - those who have guided us, shaped us, and loved us unconditionally. We celebrate their sacrifices, their wisdom, and their devotion. We reaffirm our commitment to the sacred journey of fatherhood in all of its forms, knowing that in its embrace lies the true essence of what it means to be a fully human child of God.
