The mission of the PSEC Addiction & Recovery Taskforce is to share God's love with people suffering from the destructive disease of addiction and their affected family members and friends. Our goal is to decrease stigma surrounding addiction by broadening individual knowledge, awareness, and understanding while providing support, resources, and other vital information about this disease to ministers and congregations.



- <u>Prisoner Pen Pals</u>: The Pen Pal Program continues to be a success, through a group of individuals paired up with inmates at Phoenix Maximum Security State Prison in Graterford. These pen pal relationships are formed over time and provide both individuals an opportunity to share the love of God with each other. People dedicated to this Ministry report sharing in theological discussions, life-stories, the joys and trials of everyday life, and so much more. We look forward to continuing these vital relationships!
- <u>Sync Recovery</u>: The program 'Sync Recovery' is established at Trinity Telford UCC, holding monthly events offering snacks, activities, games, various recovery meetings and fellowship. This is open to anyone and is not bound by any one specific recovery program.
- <u>**PSEC** eNews</u>: Weekly articles surrounding topics of addiction and various resources have been published in the eNews for more than 200 weeks! We pray these articles reach beyond our wildest expectations.
- <u>Narcan Distribution Points</u>: We currently have two churches that are established as dedicated Narcan Distribution Points. These are: Trinity Telford UCC & Trinity UCC Pottstown. - <u>*Recovery Books*</u>: The Task Force retains a number of Recovery books, free for anyone who would like one for themselves, a loved one, or someone they know who might benefit from it. - <u>Caron Foundation</u>: The Task Force has been invited to lead an Interfaith Chapel Service at Caron Foundation towards the end of summer. During this service, Alumni and families join with patients to celebrate the ongoing work of healing individuals and families. We are honored to have the opportunity to share God's love and message.
- <u>Speaking Events</u>: Task Force members participated in an Addiction Crisis & Narcan Training Event sponsored by Epler's UCC on March 22nd. This event was held in conjunction with Berks County Behavioral Health. Status of the current addiction crisis and training for the use of Narcan was presented by BCBH. Personal testimonies were presented by the Addiction & Recovery Task Force. This was a powerful time of resources and reflection.
 - Additionally, the Task Force has presented a number of speaking events on topics like Harm Reduction, Grandparents raising Grandchildren, and sharing of the Mission in various worshiping congregations.
