PSEC Anniversary Churches... Christ UCC, Hegins —150 Years

In the year 1817 a large log cabin church was built in Hegins and was named Friedens Church. It served both the Reformed and Evangelical Lutheran congregation. This included the people of Fountain. Many years later in 1840 Frederick Dinger donated the land across the



road from the present Christ Church for the purpose of building a school. For 34 years this one room log building served as both school and church.

In 1873 they tore down Friedens Church in Hegins and build a new red brick church which left the people of Fountain without a church. It was decided to build in Fountain using money collected from the community to buy land from George Dinger.

In Spring of 1874 the cornerstone was laid and by November the building was dedicated. Membership numbered around 50.

1886 the church was Incorporated
1924 electric lights were installed
1934 installation of stain glass windows
1963 Christ and Friedens Churches merge to become Hegins Valley Charge
2000 became handicap accessible
2008 sanctuary renovated
2012 Pastor Claude Schach retired after 18 years of service
2020 Services held in parking lots during summer months, due to Covid and today we celebrate the church's 150th anniversary.
